



**Canadian College and University Fairs (CCUF)
National Virtual Education Fair
2021 Contest
Terms and Conditions**

The Canadian College and University Fair (CCUF) National Virtual Education Fair \$3,500 Cash Prize 2021 is open to any student aged 16 years or older who registers, attends and engages with at least one exhibitor at the CCUF National Virtual Education Fair on October 22 or 23, 2021.

Contest Rules

No purchase necessary.

To participate in the Contest, do the following:

- Register for free admission to the fair at <https://ccuf.ca/ccuf-national-virtual-education-fair-2021>, and while attending the event on either day (October 22 or 23, 2021) request information from one or more exhibitor.
- Be a student who is currently attending or planning to attend a school.
- Each event registrant will receive a login for the virtual fair platform closer to the date of the event. They will use this login to access the fair during one or both days outlined above. The system will track who has logged in during that time.
- Accumulate points through the gamification module by attending presentations, visiting booths, and asking questions. The grand prize will be given to the student participant with the highest point count at the end of the fair. If this total is a tie, a recipient will be randomly selected from among the top scorers.

Prizing – The contest prize is for \$3,500.00 CDN.

Any costs associated with receiving the prizing are the responsibility of the winner. CCUF will not be responsible or liable for any possible damages or injuries that may occur as a result of the use of a Prize. To be declared a winner, the selected entrant will be required to sign a release, waiver of liability and indemnity.

Odds of winning will depend on the number of eligible participants who complete their registration and attend the online event on one of the two days. Entries will not be eligible if the registrant has not attended in accordance with these Contest Rules.

Draw – A random draw by a representative of CCUF shall be made from all entries received and will take place at approximately 12:00 pm on November 5, 2021. Selected entrants will be contacted by email at the email address indicated on their registration form.

If the selected entrant cannot be reached within five (5) business days following the first attempt of contact, incorrectly answers the skill-testing question, declines the prize, or fails to return a Release of Liability as specified below, CCUF reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to select another entrant or to cancel the prize.

To be declared a winner, selected entrants must first correctly answer, unaided, a time-limited, mathematical skill-testing question and must also sign a Declaration of Compliance with the Contest Rules and a full Liability and Publicity Release. In the event the selected entrant is a minor, the entrant's parent or legal guardian will be deemed to be the entrant who must meet all contest eligibility requirements and who may accept the prize on behalf of the minor. Contest judges' rulings are final and without appeal in all matters related to the promotion and the awarding of prizes.

Prize must be accepted as awarded. No substitutions, alterations, cash equivalents or redemptions will be made. Prizes may not be transferred or assigned except if expressly consented to by CCUF. Where applicable, a Contest winner is responsible for all taxes, surcharges and fees associated with receipt or use of the Prize.
